

CAMP CODE OF CONDUCT

Dear Camp Participant,

I wish to thank you for your participation in our Fundamental Basketball Camp. By serving as a member of our camp, you are contributing to the development of basketball skills, life skills and emotional/social development.

The sole purpose of our camp is to provide the participants with the opportunity to improve their skills, fundamentals and develop a sincere interest in the game. By providing these basic fundamentals it also gives us the opportunity to teach our campers the fundamentals of life, discipline, respect, hard work, and listening. These are core values that are instilled on a daily camp schedule. These same fundamentals are also a part of our staff policies. Here is our camp code of conduct.

1. When camp meets at Gym our coaches will make sure that our campers are lined up, quiet, seated and paying attention to the camp directors daily instructions. No earrings, jewelry, ipods/CD players or hats. No hard fouls or foul language. Respect will be given to adults at all times. This is the time when valuable information is being given and we need the campers cooperation as well as the coaches.
2. Our coaches are experienced and qualified and are to coach and provide proper instruction. We expect our coaches to do their absolute best at helping the camper develop as close to his/her potential as possible. This camp is solely to improve on fundamental skills. This is not an All Star Camp! The greatest satisfaction for our coaches is not going undefeated, but knowing that the camper has improved on their fundamental skills and has left our camp with a better understanding of the game and life situations.
3. We expect our coaches to conduct themselves the same as what we ask from our campers. Responsibility comes along with being an adult and a coach. All coaches will have background checks before participating in camp. We ask our coaches to act properly with their language and coaching techniques. Campers, coaches and parents will at all times show good sportsmanship before and after games. Doing the games, remember that the officials are doing the best possible job. No one will agree on every call, so let them do their job and you do yours. Problem campers will see camp director. If necessary they will be escorted home. Any other problems campers and/or coaches will be directed to see camp director.
